The commercial age verification vendors would provide this infrastructure (Jumio) charge \$0.10 to \$2.00 per proprietary SDKs, demand API keys, commercial accounts, and operate no self-hosted option. The US bills assume every operating system built by a corporation with the infrastructure revenue to absorb these costs. That's the opposite assumption and accordingly.

Zero reported transactions between a parent and its own company staff move freely between them. (NCOSE's lobbying spending tripled \$204,000, coinciding with DCA's late ASAA legislative push.

By registering every PAC at the state level, rather than federally, Meta scatters filing of state ethics commission database records into different formats, different disclosure timelines, and no centralized search. Each filing is tedious to find. Aggregating them into a coherent dataset requires manually querying each state. This is a major source of opacity by fragmentation.

Forge the Future's stated policy is "Empowering parents with oversight of their children's online activities across devices and environments." That is functionally ASAA framing.

The firm that bridges bc

Hilltop Public Solutions, a Democratic-leaning public affairs firm, shows up in three distinct connections:

1. Co-leads ATEP, Meta's \$45M PAC
2. Involved in DCA's messaging strategy, per investigative reporting
3. Connected to Forge the Future, a downstream Texas PAC with

policy priorities

This makes Hilltop the first confirm bridging Meta's political spending the DCA advocacy campaign. The Meta elect "tech-friendly" state leg coordinates messaging for the nor independent grassroots organizati legislators to pass ASAA.

The dark money network

Meta's Colorado lobbying runs thru Strategies, paid \$338,500 since 2021 with monthly payments jumping from \$5K/month to \$14K-\$30K/month in 2023 as state-level age verificatio accelerated.

Headwaters co-founder Adam Eich simultaneously serves as a registered lobbyist in Colorado, as Chair of the New Venture Fund (the flagship of the Arabella Advisors network, \$669M) as founding board member of the Sixteen Thirty Fund (another Arabella entity, \$311M) the Arabella network operates four entities in the same building at 1828 L Street NW DC, with combined annual revenue of \$1.2 billion. NVF transfers \$121.3M per year. Sixteen Thirty Fund, a 501(c)(4) v charity, is exempt from disclosure requirements.

I parsed the IRS Form 990 Schedule I for all five Arabella entities. That's 4,400 grants totaling approximately \$2.0 billion every child safety, age verification organization I could identify. Zero Schedule I grant pathway is defined. If Meta money flows through this network, it has to travel via fiscal sponsorships, fees, or non-grant payments, which are less transparent.

The Eichberg connection matters because it proves a pipeline, but because the structure of the largest anonymous advocacy network in US politics. The overlap is documented regardless of how money moves through it.

The company that benefited

Meta's own Horizon OS (powering headsets) already has Meta Account verification, a Get Age Category A parental controls, Quest Store age default minor account protections. OS at 83% compliance readiness vs mandates.

Meta is not opposing these bills. It pulled lobbying records from the State's SODA API and found Meta's lobbyists on SB26-051 listed in a "pro" position. Not amending, not opposing.

On every social media regulation bill Meta takes an "Amending" position fighting changes. Across 117 lobbyist 22 bills:

- Bills regulating social media: "Amending" (fighting)
- The one bill putting the burden on providers: Meta position is "Amending" (watching)

Meta fights bills that regulate Meta's products while bills that regulate everyone else.

In California, Meta spent over \$1 million lobbying in the first three quarters of 2025. Meta publicly supported AB-1043, breaking its own trade associations (TechNet and Net of Progress both opposed it). Meta's position that creates surveillance infrastructure at a federal level while leaving social media products untouched.

Meta's LD-2 filings with the Senate on H.R. 3149/S. 1586, the App Store Act, as a lobbied bill. The filing name is "protecting children, bullying prevention; youth safety and federal privacy youth restrictions on social media." In the same filing, Meta also lobbies on KOSA 2025 which would regulate Meta directly. In the same filing, Meta also lobbies on the bill that burdens its competitors. Meta also appears to weaken the bills that burden itself. Meta's lobbyist filings appear in the same quarterly disclosure.

This section documents what happened. This investigation was posted to Reddit in context on Meta's documented his astroturfing, coordinated reporting manipulation to suppress unfavorable

What happened

The original version of this investigation was posted to [r/linux](#), where it was mass pulled down pending moderator request. **upvotes, roughly 15k views before being pulled down some 40 minutes after posted)**

The content that was suppressed included lobbying firms, traces documented Senate LD-2 filings, and links to If identifies Hilltop Public Solutions a confirmed entity bridging Meta's \$ and the DCA astroturf campaign. The content that a well-resourced actor used as a reason to suppress.

I cannot prove the mass reports were manufactured rather than organic. That is the problem with Reddit's infrastructure makes it impossible to distinguish genuine community observations from manufactured ones, and it rewards either way by automatically removing

Meta has done this before

In March 2022, the Washington Post reported that Meta hired Targeted Victory, one of the top Republican consulting firms in the nation, to run a nationwide astroturfing campaign. Internal emails obtained by the Post confirmed the campaign:

- Placed op-eds and letters to regional news outlets across the country, none of which disclosed the source as Meta or Targeted Victory
- Promoted stories about dangerous "trends" that had actually originated on Facebook

- Pushed local politicians and j to frame TikTok as a threat t
- In an internal email, a camp wrote that the "dream woulc with headlines like 'From dar how TikTok has become the social media space for kids'"

Meta's spokesman defended the c saying "all platforms should face a consistent with their growing succ not deny hiring the firm or directir The story was confirmed by the W Fortune, Variety, CBS News, Enga Media, the Boston Globe, and Tech others.

This is not speculation about what This is what Meta has been publicl doing: hiring firms to plant stories public concern about competitors as the framing, and conceal the cc the messaging. The Targeted Victo the DCA campaign use the same p outside entity to push messaging t Meta's commercial interests while involvement.

Reddit's bot and astrotu problem is structural

Research published in Nature (Sci documented coordinated political ; patterns across platforms includin separate study found that at least in surveyed subreddits was postec trolls or bot accounts designed to public opinion.

Since June 2025, bot networks ha systematically exploiting Reddit ar moderation systems through mas Thousands of legitimate Facebook deleted after coordinated bot repo automated enforcement. What this means for this investigation

Meta spent \$26.3 million on federal 2025 and deployed 86+ lobbyists. It funded a nationally active advocacy with no legal existence in the IRS Hilltop Public Solutions to simulate a \$45M super PAC and coordinate D. It previously hired Targeted Victory for an astrourfing campaign against TikTok safety as the narrative frame.

This investigation documents all of primary sources. A post containing was mass reported on Reddit with suppressed site-wide by automated. Whether the reports were organic the outcome is the same: the content removed from the platform where the motive and the documented content suppress it.

The research is published in a git repository every source embedded. It does not use Reddit's infrastructure to survive.

Those three are NCOSE (National Center on Sexual Exploitation), the Institute for Family Studies, and the Ethics and Public Policy Center. The last two received \$50,000 each specifically for a "Protect Kids Online" initiative that produced the policy research underlying the ASAA framework.

There's also a direct personnel pipeline. Annie Chestnut Tutor worked as a legislative assistant to Senator Mike Lee, where her portfolio included tech and telecom policy. Lee introduced the federal ASAA. Tutor then moved to Heritage Foundation as a policy analyst, where she now publishes reports advocating for the same bill her former boss introduced. Her testimonial was on the DCA website from its very first day of existence, before the organization was even publicly announced. She shaped the bill in Lee's office, advocates for it at Heritage, and endorsed the coalition pushing it from launch day.

On top of that, Tiffany Justice, co-founder of Moms for Liberty (another DCA coalition member), was hired as Executive Vice President of Heritage Action for America in July 2025. So two of DCA's six named members are now functionally the same organization at the leadership level.

Meanwhile, a Heritage Foundation fellow named Dustin Carmack, who authored the Intelligence Community chapter of **Project 2025**, was hired by **Meta** in **May 2024**. So there's personnel flowing in **both** directions.

On your point about the EU and UK: the comparison actually helps illustrate the problem. The EU's Digital Services Act and related frameworks include explicit exemptions for open source software. None of the US bills do. California AB-1043 defines "Operating System Provider" as anyone who develops, licenses, or controls an OS on any general purpose computing device. That language covers volunteer-maintained Linux distributions.

Six US states have enacted or introduced bills from the same template and not one contains a FOSS carve-out. Whether that's intentional or just negligent drafting, the effect is the same. We will upload more files regarding the Heritage Foundation later this week.
